UNIT 4 - SKELETAL SYSTEM

Radiologist (Diagnostic Services)- The radiologist reads X-rays and CAT scans or administer non-radioactive materials into patient's blood streams for diagnostic purposes. They specialize in other modalities such as computed tomography, ultrasound, and magnetic resonance imagery.

Radiology Technician (Diagnostic Services) – Maintain and use equipment and supplies necessary to demonstrate portions of the human body on X-ray film or fluoroscopic screen for diagnostic purposes.

Orthopedic Surgeon (Therapeutic Services) – An orthopedic surgeon is a physician who specializes in the evaluation, diagnosis, and treatment (both surgical and non-surgical) of painful musculoskeletal diseases and conditions. Some specialize in certain body areas such as knees and shoulders, while others handle a broader range.

Certified Nurse Assistant (CAN) (Therapeutic Services) – Certified nurse assistant is a health career that literally assists the nursing staff by assisting patients with the activities of daily living (bathing, eating, turning, walking...) as well as taking vital signs and meeting patients needs.

Medical Transcriptionist (Health linformatics) – The transcriptionist types medical records, surgical procedure records, and treatment records that have been dictated by the physician or other health care professional who performed the procedure.
