In this tutorial, you will learn how to create an H5P Summary.

### 1. Overview of the Summary Content Type

The H5P Summary content type requires learners to choose the correct response from a list of statements. Creators have the option to add as many lists of statements as they like.

**IMPORTANT:** Before creating any H5P element, turn on editing for your course site. Under the section or topic where the H5P element is to appear, click the **Add an activity** dropdown menu and choose **Interactive Content** from the list. Save your work periodically, and try out the features as you create them to help you understand how they function.

**Note:** See tutorial **0—General H5P Settings** for instructions on how to set up H5P activities for grades and other information.

# 2. Adding a Summary

The following steps walk you through the process of adding a Summary activity.

Step	Action	Notes
1.	In the <b>Name</b> field, type in a name for the H5P interaction.	For training purposes, type: Summary.

Step	Action	Notes
2.	In the Editor section choose <b>Summary</b> from the dropdown menu of content types. When selecting this H5P activity for the first time, click the <b>Use</b> button.	The Interactive Summary editor should appear.
3.	Enter your introductory text for the summary interaction in the <b>Introduction text</b> field.	For training, leave this at the default: Choose the correct statement.
4.	Enter the correct statement into the first of the <b>Statement</b> fields.	Only the first statement is correct.
		For training purposes, type: A failure to listen is an internal barrier to communication.
5.	Enter at least one incorrect statement in the following <b>Statement</b> field(s).	You can add as many incorrect statements as you wish by clicking on the gray <b>Add statement</b> button.
		For training purposes, type: A lack of interest is an external barrier to communication.
6.	Click the blue <b>ADD STATEMENTS</b> button.	
7.	Enter the correct statement into the first of the <b>Statement</b> fields.	For training purposes, type: Being a good listener during a disagreement can improve overall health.
8.	Enter at least one incorrect statement in the following <b>Statement</b> field(s).	You can add as many incorrect statements as you wish by clicking on the gray <b>Add statement</b> button. For training purposes, type:
		Being a good listener during a disagreement doesn't improve the other person's perception of you.
9.	Click the gray <b>Add statement</b> button to add one more incorrect statement in the <b>Statement</b> field.	For training purposes, type: Being a good listener during a disagreement doesn't strengthen your relationship with the other person.
10.	Click <b>Save and display</b> at the bottom of the screen when finished editing.	This step applies when using H5P content in a Moodle server, such as ctYOU.org. Saving may be different in other applications.

**IMPORTANT:** Be sure to test the multimedia elements you created for this tutorial. Once completed, you can use this H5P feature as a standalone, embed its iframe code in a webpage, or you can download it for use in another courses.
