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

How many of the pieces of cake had at least 2 of their sides with icing?



There were 12 pieces on the top layer with at least 2 sides with icing. The other three layers each have 4 pieces that have two sides with icing on them. Making a total of 24 pieces with icing on at least 2 sides.

5. ode      Answer: add a M to get modem






