

Post-Launch Lesson Plan

GRADE K, PLANET C | ORGANIZERS IN ACTION

Objectives

- Students will reflect on the importance of being organized and how it helps in daily tasks.
- Students will identify jobs of people who are organized.
- Students will practice organizing objects and work together to complete tasks.

Preparation & Materials Needed

- Handout
- Scissors
- Crayons

Lesson Plan

Total Time: 10-15 minutes

INTRODUCTION

5-7 Minutes

Remember, on Planet C, people keep things neat and orderly. Let's think about how being organized can help us in our classroom, at home, and in our daily lives!

Write the word "organize" on the board again.

Ask students to think about how being organized makes things easier and faster. Ask them to share ways they keep their room or toys organized at home.

- *How did you feel when everything was organized?*
- *Why do you think it's important to organize things?*
- *How does being organized help people at work or at home?*
- *Can you think of a job where being organized is really important?*



ACTIVITY

10-12 Minutes

Be a Librarian for a Day!

Explain that librarians organize books by author and by type. Provide students a handout showing different book titles to organize. Allow time for students to color them in.

Then, ask students to sort their books into two groups. They could sort by the shape on them, the colors they used, or the letter at the beginning of the title.

Ask students to share with their desk mates how they chose to sort their “books!”


Optional: Schedule a class visit to your local library to speak with the librarian about how books are sorted!

To conclude, remind the students that organizing is a helpful way to get things done more quickly and easily.


