
### Video




# Challenge Assignment

Planet A, The Artistic Planet

On Planet A, the artistic planet, students learn about interviewing people about their occupations.

In the game on this planet, students read a transcript of an informational interview with an architect. Then they respond artistically by creating a collage of images and words inspired by the interview. The first activity for this planet asks students to decide what would be good questions to ask when conducting an informational interview. The second activity asks students to reflect on how much they would like to do the kinds of tasks people with artistic interests and occupations do.

Here are suggestions for supporting your child's learning:

- **Ask:** What do you like or dislike about doing art projects? How is an architect like an artist? What other occupations make use of creative talents? (Examples include occupations like singers, dancers, musicians, painters and sculptors. Other examples include occupations we might not initially think of as artistic such as florists, television reporters, interpreters and designers of all kinds, from fashion to industry. Be creative as you brainstorm together about careers that thrive on creativity.)
- **Do:** Encourage your child to talk to people who work in different kinds of occupations about what they do. Work together to write a list of questions you could ask someone about that person's job. You or your child's teacher or counselor could help your child arrange an informational interview with someone whose job interests them.









### Questions
