Student Learning Objectives for Level 5

After completing Level 5, students will be able to do the following:

- Name and describe six ways to learn more about occupations that interest them: job shadowing; internships; informational interviews; volunteer work and service learning; leadership; and library and online research.
- Describe the impact of individual interests and abilities on career choices.
- Reflect on and begin to express their own work-related interests and preferences and how that might affect their career choices.
- Describe factors that influence career choices, such as job description, geographic location, working conditions, work schedule, salary.
- Investigate people's rationale for making career choices.

- Employ appropriate speaking and listening techniques used in conversation.
- Identify and evaluate resources for learning about occupations and job opportunities.
- Describe and discuss the kinds of decisions leaders/ entrepreneurs make.
- Explain the importance of working cooperatively with others to complete a task.
- Identify effective group interaction strategies.
- Name some of the risks and rewards of leadership/ entrepreneurship.
- Identify additional occupations that are typical of each of the six Holland work environments.
