Preschool & Elementary Administrator

Administers are usually principals or directors who manage programs and schools, including teachers and staff, curriculum, activities, budget, security. Overall, they ensure the environment is adequate for learning.2

Preschool, Kindergarten, or **Elementary School Teacher**

Preschool teachers focus on the basics (colors, shapes, numbers, social behavior, etc.) so children are prepared to enter a proper school setting. Kindergarten teachers continue to help develop mental, physical, and social skills. Elementary school teachers incorporate specific subjects, assign more detailed homework, and create lesson plans per curriculum requirements.2

Home-Based Service Provider

Home-based service providers, often called nannies or caregivers, work one-on-one in the child's home. They combine the comfort of home with the value of an early education. With a great amount of trust from the parent or gardians, at-home services providers help with additional tasks in the home while continuing to develop the child's skills.3



Average salary: Ranges from \$14,000 to \$35,000³

Special Education Teacher

Special education teachers work with children who have a variety of social, academic, emotional, or physical delays or impairments. By assessing and working with each student, these teachers help develop plans to meet their individual needs. Special education teachers play a vital role in student success; they are essential for enhancing students' long-term development.4
