## Time Management Simulations 1 & 2 Pre-Planning Assignment and Expectations

There are 2 different Time Management Simulations in the Leadership Course. Student will need to complete the **Oncology Lesson** prior to these Simulations. This will help with patient care. Students will complete assessments, passing medications and taking care of patient/nursing issues on **two** assigned patients. Students will have **50 minutes** in each simulation to complete their tasks. You can find your patient's "chart" the ctyou.org Simulation-Multiple Patient course. Complete **Simulation Preplanning Case Study** on their **two** assigned patients (look below patient name for assigned sim ex. Time Management I). **You also must complete Drug cards, Quick Drug Reference and a "Nursing Brain" for both patients.** 

These assignments **MUST** be completed and brought with you for your simulation. Assignments will be checked by instructors and will be your "ticket" to participate in the simulation. These hours maybe counted in place of clinical and will be graded based on the clinical grading sheet. You will be expected to be prepared, punctual, and professional for this simulation. Come prepared as you would for a clinical day in **scrubs**. Don't forget your **stethoscope**, **pen light**, **watch**, **bandage scissors and other accessories you take to clinical**. You will also need **your laptops or tablet/iPad** for computerized charts and charting. Most importantly, come with a positive, flexible attitude and let's have fun learning!!!

## **Learning Objective:**

- 1. Evaluates patient safety measures and therapeutic communications.
- 2. Prioritizes and implements Physician Orders appropriately.
- 3. Evaluate patient care based on patient assessment information including vital signs, lab value, etc.
- 4. Implements the "5 rights" of medication administration.
- 5. Applies knowledge of prescribed medications indications, contraindications, and potential adverse effects.
- 6. Interpret metabolic imbalances as evidenced by lab values.
- 7. Summarize effective patient teaching on disease process.

## Expectations of Time Management Simulations 1 & 2

- Obtain report on your assigned patients
- Perform nursing duties to assigned patient. Examples:
  - Obtaining/Gathering pertinent information for patient care
  - Patient Assessments
  - Charting
  - Proper Administration of medications
- Notify Charge Nurse/Physician with any patient issues
- Professionally deal with potential nursing issues (ex. Safety)
- Perform all of these tasks in a timely manner while setting priorities
- Any injections you are authorized to give should be drawn up in the syringe and placed in the ziplock bags (patient's stomach). You will be expected to identify the site you would be injecting.
