Priority Care Simulations 1 & 2 Pre-Planning Assignment and Expectations

Priority Care 1 Preplan: You can find your patient's "chart" the ctyou.org Simulation-Multiple Patient course. Complete **Simulation Preplanning Case Study** on their **three** assigned patients (look below patient name for assigned sim ex. Time Management I). **You also must complete Drug cards, Quick Drug Reference and a "Nursing Brain" on all three patients.** .

Priority Care 2 Preplan: Find you patients' "charts" and update the information on your Case Study from Priority Care 1 for the same patients you had previously and complete a Simulation Preplanning Case Study on any new patient/s. You also must have Drug cards for all **three** patients.

These assignments **MUST** be completed and brought with you for your simulation. Assignments will be checked by instructors and will be your "ticket" to participate in the simulation. These hours maybe counted in place of clinical and will be graded based on the clinical grading sheet. You will be expected to be prepared, punctual, and professional for this simulation. Come prepared as you would for a clinical day in **scrubs**. Don't forget your **stethoscope**, **pen light**, **watch**, **bandage scissors and other accessories you take to clinical**. You will also need **your laptops or tablet/iPad** for computerized charts and charting. Most importantly, come with a positive, flexible attitude and let's have fun learning!!!

Learning Objective:

- 1. Evaluates and adjusts care of patient based on assessment and laboratory information.
- 2. Implements the "6 rights" of medication administration.
- 3. Prioritizes care in a timely manner.

Expectations of Priority Care Simulations 1 & 2

- Obtain report on your assigned patients
- Perform nursing duties to assigned patient. Examples:
 - Obtaining/Gathering pertinent information for patient care
 - Patient Assessments
 - Charting
 - Proper Administration of medications including giving reason patient is on medication.
- Notify Charge Nurse/Physician with any patient issues
- Professionally deal with potential nursing issues (Ex. Upset family members, safety issues, etc.)
- Perform all of these tasks in a timely manner while setting priorities
- Injections: Draw up correct amount and place in zip lock bag with medication vial

CRITICAL FAILS INCLUDE MEDICATION ERRORS, REPEATATIVE ERRORS IN STUDENT'S PAST PERFORMANCES, OR ANY SAFETY ISSUES.
