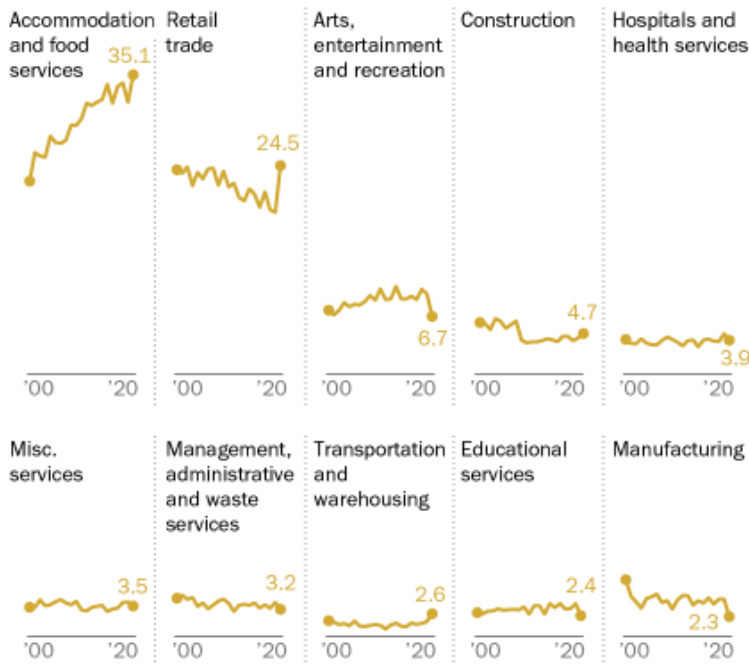
- Questions to ask when reading graphs:

Hospitality and retail sectors still largest sources of teen summer jobs

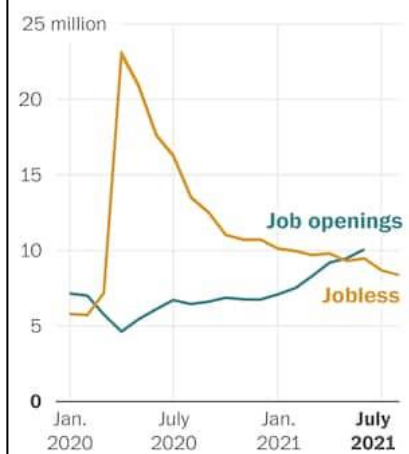
Share of employment among U.S. 16- to 19-year-olds in July of each year
