



OKACTE is excited to offer members the opportunity to join or renew their membership with OKACTE Membership Dues Installment Plan! This opportunity is available to OKACTE members whose annual dues total \$100 or more.

How does the OkACTE Membership Installment Plan work?

- This plan only covers membership dues. Optional items such as PAC cannot be included in payment installments.
- Primary and secondary dues can be included in payment installment.
- Members select between two installment payment options
- 4-installment plan (June September)
- 2-installment plan (September & October).
- Members select the date of ACH: 5th or 20th monthly

How to Apply:

- Complete the OkACTE Membership Installment Plan form.
- Submit the form by March 31 for the 4-installment plan.
- Submit the form by **August 6** for the 2-installment plan.
- Participating members must complete enrollment form by appropriate deadline to initiate initial payment.
- 4-installation payments May 31
- 2-installation payments August 6

Film Industry Training Programs

Oklahoma CareerTech and the Film Education Institute of Oklahoma (FEIO) recently signed a memorandum of understanding to work together and with other industry partners to provide training and curriculum to meet the film industry's employment demands.

"This partnership is another example of how Oklahoma CareerTech is helping overcome the skills gap facing Oklahoma industries," said Marcie Mack, CareerTech state director. "We are excited to add these training programs to our repertoire."

Production companies are increasingly choosing to film in Oklahoma, thanks to tax rebates, unique locations and workers looking for opportunity. Recent movies filmed in the state include "Minari," which has been nominated for six Academy Awards, including Best Picture, and won a Golden Globe for best foreign language film.

CareerTech's network of school districts, technology centers and skills centers will offer career training for photographers, set designers, hair and makeup artists, grips, gaffers and other film

and television production professionals. Training programs are already being developed, and more will be offered under the agreement. BMITE programs are in a great position to become a leader in these training efforts. Look for more information and opportunities to come.

Continued growth in the film industry in Oklahoma, however, may depend on the state's ability to provide a trained workforce, one reason CareerTech and FEIO are working together. FEIO's mission is to connect students from across the state with the film and television industry, said Trevor Rogers, FEIO executive director.

"Oklahoma's CareerTech System has served as a golden standard for education and workforce development in our state for many years," he said. "That is why our growing film industry saw it as imperative to form a partnership and take this exciting new venture to the next level."

The Oklahoma Film and Music Office estimates more than 10,000 Oklahoma jobs borne from 33 film and television projects using the state's incentive program will directly pump more than \$161 million into the state's economy in fiscal 2021, which ends June 30. More than 150 additional projects are not part of the incentive program.

photography and law is a complex place. At one of those crossroads lies copyright. Many photographers aren't familiar with this important topic and are left struggling with questions like "How do I register my work?" and "What protections do my copyrights provide when I discover that my photos have been used without permission?" Carolyn Wright is a photographer and attorney who specializes in photographer's rights. She also publishes the popular Photo Attorney blog, where she writes about these issues.
