OKACTE is excited to offer members the opportunity to join or renew their membership with OKACTE Membership Dues Installment Plan! This opportunity is available to OKACTE members whose annual dues total \$100 or more.

How does the OkACTE Membership Installment Plan work?

Teaching to Lead: Teacher Institute

The <u>Teaching to Lead: Teacher Institute</u> will provide a unique "quick start" opportunity to beginning CareerTech teachers, whom do not hold a degree in education. The program is intended for alternative and provisional teachers with less than two years of teaching

experience. This rigorous program provides beginning teachers with critical classroom strategies and foundational skills. The application is open. Below are a few highlights of the program:

- Program begins on July 27, 2021 and ending May 11, 2022
- Participants have an opportunity to obtain university credit
- Oklahoma Lottery Trust Fund Scholarship is available to each participant
- 2021-2022 Tentative Cohort Dates (see attachment)
- Registration fee of \$750 (college tuition expense not included)
- Fee includes meals and materials provided during the training
- Participants will have an instructional coach and an on-site mentor during the first year
- Mentors will commit to spending 72 hours in one-on-one mentoring with the new teacher
- Mentors will receive a payment of \$500 for providing 72 hours of mentoring

Emergency Broadband Benefit

The Oklahoma Society for Technology in Education (OKSTE) announced it is working to help build consumer awareness about the Emergency Broadband Benefit, a new Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program. The temporary benefit will help to lower the cost of broadband service for eligible households during the on-going COVID-19 pandemic.

The \$3.2B Emergency Broadband Benefit program provides a discount of up to \$50 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for qualifying households on qualifying Tribal lands. The benefit also provides up to a \$100 per household discount toward a one-time purchase of a computer, laptop, or tablet if the household contributes more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase through a participating broadband provider.

A household is eligible if one member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 135% of the <u>Federal Poverty Guidelines</u>or participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid or the FCC's <u>Lifeline</u> program;
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program
 or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility
 Provision, in the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year;
- Experienced a substantial loss of income through job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020 and the household had a total income in 2020 at or below \$99,000 for single filers and \$198,000 for joint filers; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income or COVID-19 program.

Emergency Broadband Benefit enrollment will begin (opened) on May 12, 2021. Eligible households can enroll through a <u>participating broadband provider</u> or directly with the <u>Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC)</u> using an online or mail-in application.
