# National Cybersecurity Teaching Academy

Want to be one of the first teachers in the U.S. to earn a graduate certificate in Cybersecurity Education? The National Cybersecurity Teaching Academy (NCTA), through a recent grant, will offer a 12-credit hour graduate certificate to high school teachers and include coursework on teaching cybersecurity, foundations of cybersecurity, network security, and advanced topics. Three universities (DePaul, University of Louisville, and UA Little Rock) will offer the virtual program, with a little variation depending on the university's program.

## Follow-up Timeline CHANGED!!

The collection period for follow-up has changed this year due to new federal requirements handed down to us with Carl Perkins funding. <u>Follow-up for the 2020-2021 school year will</u> <u>be accessible, in CTIMS, from October 1, 2021 – November 30, 2021</u>.

The process of completing follow-up is the same as last year. You can find the guidebook along with additional resources like the PowerPoint & Approved Assessment List on our website here: <u>CTIMS (CareerTech Information Management System) — CareerTech (CT) - okcareertech.org</u>.

## **End-of-Course Test Reporting**

We are collecting end-of instruction test results (Pass/Fail) for <u>all</u> students. You can add students' test results at any time throughout the year as long as the students have been entered into CESI. Once test data is entered into the Certification System module, it will transfer over to the Follow-up module. For example, certification results entered for *current* students will populate in follow-up for the next collection period. (NOTE: Verify you are entering information in the correct enrollment year.)

Which certification test results should be included? Any test listed as one of the required test options on the BMITE course syllabus or testing guide should be included if your student has taken that test.

You can find the **Technical Guidebook** for entering **Student Certifications & Work Based Learning Collection** on the CTIMS website (scroll towards the bottom of the page).
