



Taught a course that you feel frustrated or disappointed with?



Teaching Basics

- Do things that get students out of their comfort zone.
- Teach them the right way to study. Trust me, they don't know!
- Create experiences find ways to connect to their existing life experience.
- Let the students play stump the teacher.
- Be prepared. Do you have a beginning, middle and end?



Get Them Ready for the Day

Build Excitement: You set the tone for the week Build Relationships: Consider SEL activities Consider Bell Ringers, Do Nows and Exit Tickets Avoid distractions by smoothing out transitions Make it relatable, relevant, and provide link to industry

Weekly Schedule

Bellwork aka bellringers aka do-nows! This helps get students engaged from the minute they walk in the door and allows you time to take attendance, take care of any odds and ends, while not wasting any instruction time. Weekly IDEAS Bellwork SCHEDULE W M In your Tool Skill work Thinking Math feelings Tuesday Wednesday. Thursday Monday Friday. Math! It's all around us! Give real world situations and industry problems for them to solve. Count back change, sale price at 15% off, 20% off, calculate gas mileage, convert to military time, budget, or an industry related math problem. Tools, Tools, Tools! Put a tool, piece of equipment or part of a machine in the front of the room. Have students identify what it is, what it is used for, how much it costs, etc. Use skills practice for bellwark. Have students take measurements of W different items in the classroom, practice taking vital signs, review and practice terms used that week in class, write steps for a skill down on paper, explain or teach a skill to another classmate. Think about it! Brain teasers, word problems, Sudako puzzles, get their brains going. Give them an industry related problem to solve or an interview question to answer. SEL Check-in. Draw an emoji for how you are feeling today, list items that F bring you JOY!, list items you are thankful for, journal entries, GIF of how you are feeling, meditation or yoga time, give situations for decision making.


