Culinary Arts and Baking and Pastry Competition Deadline

The deadline to register to compete for culinary arts and baking and pastry is **February 12th**. This is due to the fact Baking and Pastry will take place **March 4** and Culinary Arts will take place **March 5th**. If you want your student to attempt their ACF certification, they may do so with the competition. There is an additional fee for ACF certification that is worked into the registration price.

Lottery Grants FY25

FY25 Lottery Grant Applications - NOW OPEN

You are eligible to apply for this lottery grant for up to \$15,000.00. If your program received a lottery grant in FY24, you must wait one year before applying again.

What items or equipment is eligible to be placed on my lottery grant proposal?

All items or equipment requested should enhance your overall program and provide additional opportunities for all students in your program. A good rule of thumb is that if the item would be approved using 412 funds, it would be acceptable on the lottery grant proposal.

Items to NOT put on proposal:

- Equipment or resources specific only to your CTSO
- Service contracts/warranties/monthly recurring charges
- Conference registration or professional development not related to FY25 lottery grant request

Criteria:

- · The number of proposals received
- Justification of items listed on proposal
- Grammar and punctuation
- CTSO participation
- Professional Development (Required CTE PD)
- · Submitting CTE reports on time
- Utilization of current resources (412 funds, previous grants, etc.)

FCCLA Awards and Scholarships

March 1, 2024 is a major deadline for FCCLA Awards and Scholarships. The following are due March 1, 2024, and will be awarded/recognized during the State Convention on April 11, 2024:

50%. 75%, or 100% FCS Participation – This award recognizes FCS programs with 50%, 75%, or 100% of their FCS enrollment affiliated FCCLA members. Chapters will be recognized in the Closing Session of State Convention. https://oklahomafccla.org/forms

Chapter of Excellence -- The purpose of the Chapter of Excellence is to recognize FCCLA chapters that have excelled in the five components of FCCLA: membership, adviser, leadership, meetings, and projects. These are chapters that have well rounded programs and are active on the local, district, state, and national level. FCCLA Chapters receiving 20 – 29.9 points will receive a Bronze Chapter of Excellence from Oklahoma FCCLA. Chapters receiving

30 – 39.9 points will receive a Silver Chapter of Excellence award from Oklahoma FCCLA. Chapters receiving 40 points or more will receive the Gold Chapter of Excellence Award from Oklahoma FCCLA. All Chapters of Excellence award winners will be recognized on state during the annual Oklahoma FCCLA State Convention. This report is to be submitted via Google Form on the Oklahoma FCCLA website by March 1, 2024. This due date includes all FCCLA activities from March 1, 2023 – March 1, 2024. https://oklahomafccla.org/forms

Donna Kates Scholarship -- The goal of the Donna Kates Scholarship is to provide financial aid to an FCCLA member from the Southeast Region who is attending the National FCCLA Leadership Meeting. The \$500 award will be disbursed to the student after he or she attends the National Leadership Conference and fulfills all of his or her responsibilities at the meeting. https://oklahomafccla.org/scholarships-%26-grants

Grant-A-Wish FCCLA Chapter Grant -- This is a grant given to the chapter adviser for items such as camper registration, FCCLA jackets, or a project. Chapters may submit a grant requesting items or registration waivers to help enhance their members' FCCLA experience. No ask is too big! Integration of FCCLA Award – Lee & Nevaleen Selmat Scholarship -- This award is made possible with funds from the Lee & Nevaleen Selmat Endowed Scholarship. This scholarship is for a current FCS teacher when they show how they integrate FCCLA into their FCS curriculum. The \$500 award will be presented to a current Family and Consumer Sciences teacher to use on classroom supplies. https://oklahomafccla.org/scholarships-%26-grants

Oklahoma Alumni & Associate Student Scholarship/Heather Hickman Memorial Scholarship -- The Oklahoma Alumni & Associates student scholarship was established to provide financial aid to academically promising FCCLA members who will be pursuing post-secondary education. The award of \$1,500 will be disbursed to the institution once full-time status is verified. One \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating FCCLA member and one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating State Officer. https://oklahomafccla.org/scholarships-%26-grants

Wanda Holman Scholarship -- The Wanda S. Holman Memorial Adviser Scholarship was established in memory of Wanda Sue Holman, a member of the Oklahoma Alumni & Associates. Wanda attended several national FCCLA conferences, and she believed that all advisers would benefit from such experiences. The \$750 scholarship is designed to offset the cost of attending the FCCLA National Leadership Conference. National Educated Adviser Award Application
- Applicants will be recognized for their accomplishment of Adviser Professional Development hours. Evaluation will be based on the

following: Active affiliated FCCLA chapter, Professional Development Hours included on the application must have been completed between April 1, 2022, and March 1, 2023. Minimum of 5 CEUs or 50 credit hours/units (10 PDU's = 1 CEU). 3 (at minimum) of which must be from FCCLA specific events. Applications must be completed in your FCCLA portal at www.fcclainc.org

Master Adviser Award -- Master Adviser award recognizes advisers who have been successful in--

Advising an affiliated chapter for a minimum of three years, promoting the organization, operating a co-curricular chapter with a balanced program of work, facilitating youth-centered activities, keeping abreast of new happenings within the organization. Applications must be completed in your FCCLA portal at www.fcclainc.org

Spirit of Advising Award -- State Advisers should consider the following qualities in advisers when making their nomination: believes in the mission of Family, Career and Community Leaders of America, supports and works with students to ensure student success, provides learning experiences, encourages positive character development, dedicates time and energy to nurturing student leaders

- Significantly influences and encourages membership in FCCLA

Looking for Certifications for High School Students?


ACTE is offering an online **Entrepreneurship Institute** for middle and high school teachers. The cost is \$580.00 and a teacher can earn 55 hours of professional development or 3 college credits for an additional fee of \$135.00. The cost of the course can be paid for from 412/314 monies as the course provides 400+ classroom-ready resources and curriculum.

Following the training, a teacher can teach this course to students as a part of the Career Orientation class and students in grades 9-12 are then able to take the U.S. Entrepreneurship Certification Examination for High School Students.

The deadline for the Entrepreneurship Training has been extended to February 9
