
## Oklahoma Family and Consumer Science Building Blocks for Better Relationships Mini-Grant Application



Oklahoma Family and Consumer Sciences is delighted to be able to again offer a relationship curriculum and training for our teachers. The Dibble Institute has received a contract through the Oklahoma Department of Human Services to equip OK FCS teachers with a program designed for Oklahoma FCS entitled **Building Blocks for Better Relationships** (BBBR). The Building Blocks program builds resiliency and better communication skills that will enhance stronger future relationships.

Following the training, teachers will be able incorporate the BBBR curriculum (12 lessons) into of the following classes during the 2024/25 school year:

- FCS Basics
- Human Growth and Development
- Interpersonal Studies
- Counseling and Mental Health

Up to 60 experienced FCS teachers will be selected to participate in the summer training. Another 40 new teachers will be trained in the fall. Our FCS goal is to reach 6,000 students this coming year.

The training will be held on **July 31, 2024**, at the Tulsa Technology Center, Lemley Campus. Attendees will receive the following:

- One (1) BBBR instructor's manual and workbooks for students
- \$200.00 training stipend
- Reporting stipend of \$100.00 per report
- Travel reimbursements
  - Federal per diem
  - Mileage to/from Tulsa
  - Up to 2 nights of hotel costs @\$125.00 per night\*
  - o 2 days parking
