# What is a Pacing Guide

A Pacing Guide is a curriculum planning tool that outlines what content needs to be taught and when over the course of a school year or term.

## KEY PURPOSE:

- ENSURES CURRICULUM COVERAGE
- ALIGNS INSTRUCTION WITH STANDARDS
- HELPS TEACHERS STAY ON TRACK



# Why Use a Pacing Guide?

To promote consistency across pathways

Support instructional planning and time management







# Components of a Pacing Guide

MOST PACING GUIDES INCLUDE:

- Time Frame (weeks, months, quarter)
- Standards (State or national benchmarks)
- Topics or Units
- Instructional Objectives
- Suggested Resources
- Assessment Points



# How to Use a Pacing Guide

## Plan Ahead

Use it as a roadmap to plan lessons and activities each week.

## Adjust As Needed

Use it flexibly; adjust pace to meet students' needs while keeping long-term goals in mind.

## Track Progress

Mark completed objectives and adjust future plans accordingly.





# Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Not revisiting or revising throughout the year
- Skipping foundational content or stay on schedule
- Treating it as a script instead of a guide
