Career Exploration Through the Disguise a Turkey Project

LEARNING OBJECTIVE:

Students will be able to research various careers and creatively present their findings through the Disguise a Turkey project.

ASSESSMENTS:

Students will complete a project where they disguise a turkey representing their chosen career. They will submit a written report detailing the job responsibilities, required skills, and education needed for that career.

KEY POINTS:

- Understanding different career paths and their requirements.
- Importance of education and skills in career choices.
- How to creatively express career information through art.
- Research skills including gathering and summarizing information.
- Presentation skills for sharing their project with classmates.

OPENING:

- Begin with a discussion on various careers and what students aspire to be in the future.
- Show images or past examples of creatively disguised turkeys.
- Pose the question: "If you could disguise a turkey as any profession, what would it be and why?"
- Engage students in a brainstorming session about careers.
- Have students take a career/personality assessment to determine what career would fit them best or that they are interested in.

INTRODUCTION TO NEW MATERIAL:

- Introduce the concept of career exploration and its significance.
- Discuss how different careers require different skills and education.
- Explain the project guidelines and criteria for the turkey disguise.
- Common misconception: Students may think that all careers require a college degree; clarify that there are various paths including vocational training and apprenticeships.

GUIDED PRACTICE:

- Set expectations for taking a career/personality assessment and researching a career.
- Allow students to explore their options based on the assessment results through the research process by using reliable sources. I prefer O*Net but YouScience is another highly recommended one.
- Encourage students to ask questions about their chosen careers.
- Monitor groups by circulating around the room, offering support and checking for understanding.

INDEPENDENT PRACTICE:

- Once students have found a career they like, have students write down the following on a worksheet:
- title of the career chosen
- -average salary
- -education required
- -skills needed to be successful in this career.
- -What type of personality is best for this career.
- -Knowledge needed for this career
- -2 sentences on why they chose this career.
- Once students have collected their information, have them write a paragraph using their findings. The report should be written in complete sentences. Set clear deadlines for project completion and submission.
- Once students have completed their paragraph, give them the turkey template to start adding an outfit and props to disguise their turkey.
- Have students cut out their finished turkey and their paragraph and have them glue it to a colorful piece of construction paper or small poster paper.

CLOSING:

- Have students share their Disguise a Turkey projects in small groups.
- Conduct a quick reflection on what they learned about their career choices and the research process.

EXTENSION ACTIVITY:

• For students who finish early, suggest they create a digital presentation about their career, including images and additional information.

HOMEWORK:

 Ask students to interview a family member or acquaintance about their career and write a brief summary of what they learned.
