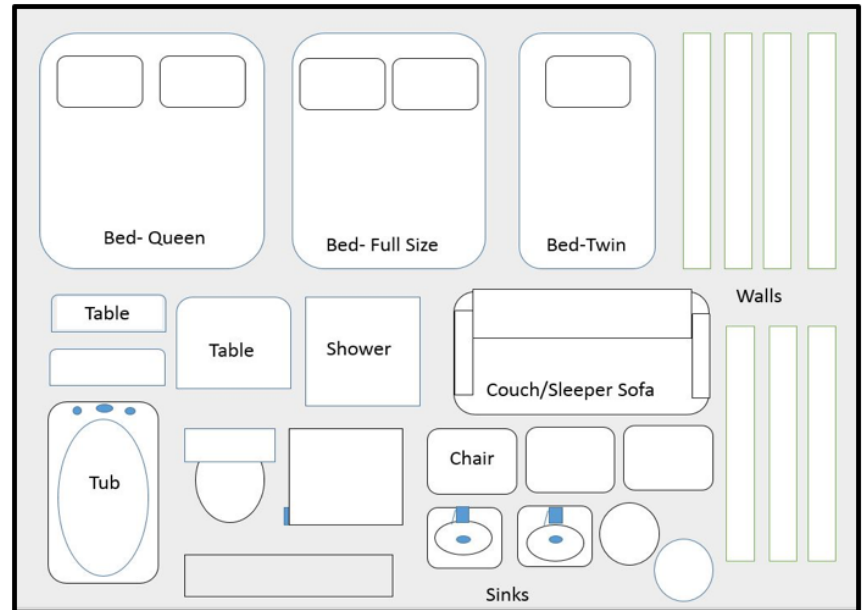
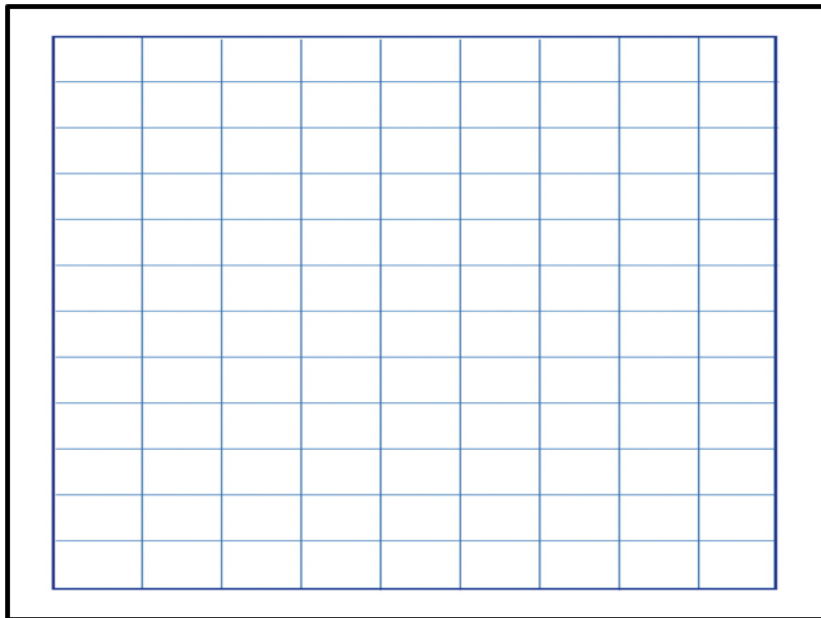

Tiny House Construction

The typical American home is about 2500 square feet. The average tiny house is about \$30,000 compared to \$400,000 of a traditional house.

Why would someone choose a tiny house?

To save money

To prevent waste in the environment

Things to think about with your tiny house!

Is the entrance conveniently located?

Are traffic patterns allowing people to move around efficiently, safety, and conveniently?

Is the house free of barriers?

Is there enough storage?

Furniture should be arranged for ease of movement around the room and to other rooms

Place larger items first, then use smaller furniture or items

Do you have a focal point?

Do you have group seating for multiple people?

Is your home aesthetically pleasing?

How would your plan be different if someone had a disability?

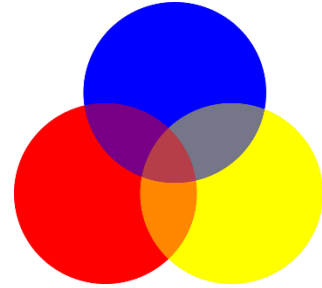
Add color to create a color scheme!

Primary Colors

Red, yellow, blue

Equal distance on the color wheel



Secondary Colors

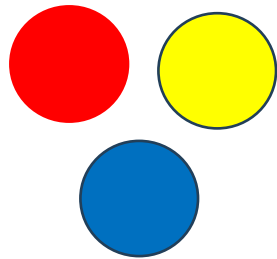
Orange, green, violet

Equal amounts of two primary colors

Intermediate Colors (Tertiary Colors)

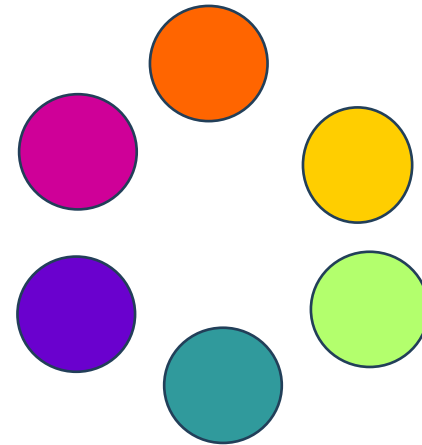
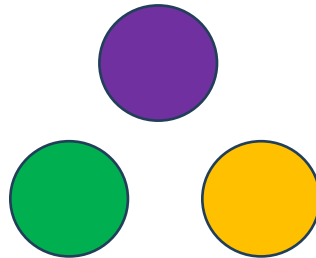
Equal amounts of adjoining primary

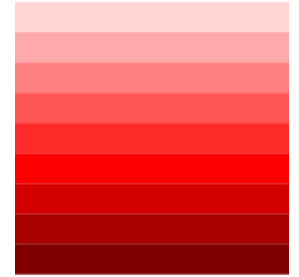

Color Schemes



Monochromatic

A one-color plan using different tints, shades, and intensities



Analogous

Uses neighboring or adjacent colors on the wheel
Sometimes called a “related” color scheme

Complementary

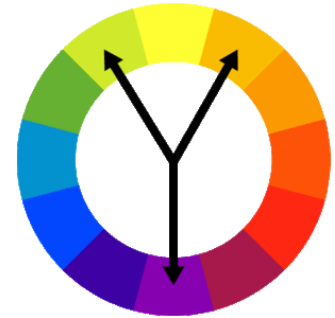
Uses opposite hues on the color wheel



Color Schemes

Split Complementary

It uses three colors- one color with the two colors on the sides of its complement



Triadic

Three colors equal distance on the wheel



Neutral

black, white, gray, or beige



Accented Neutral

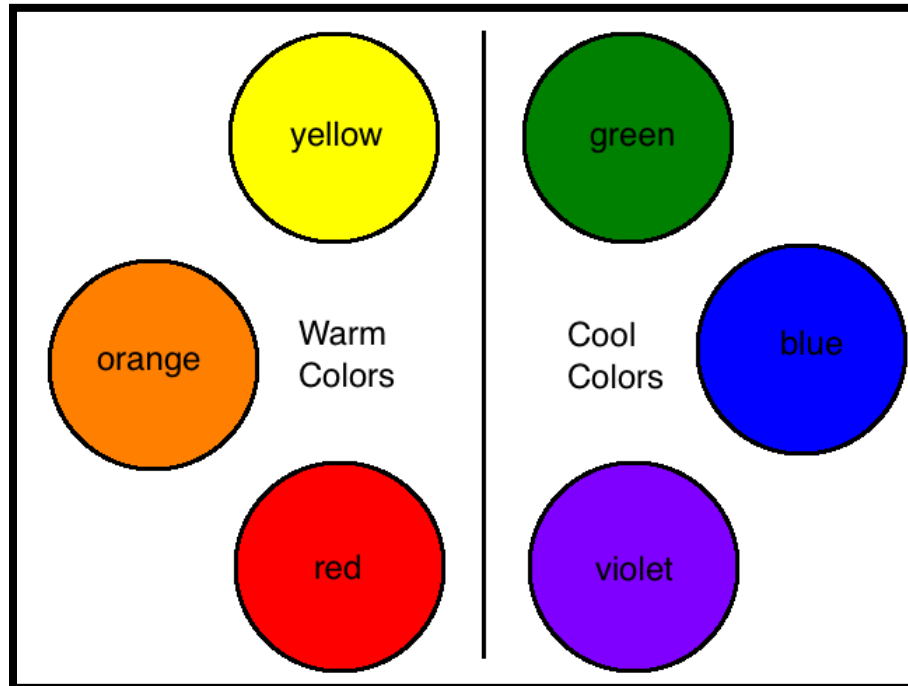
Combines black, white, gray, or beige with a bright color accent

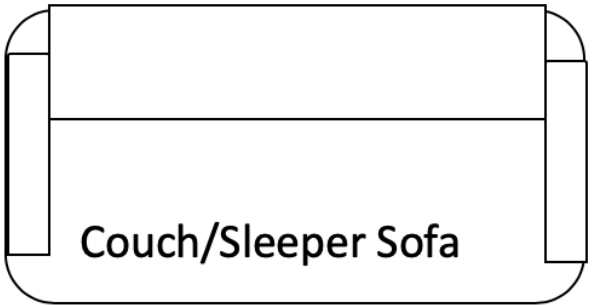
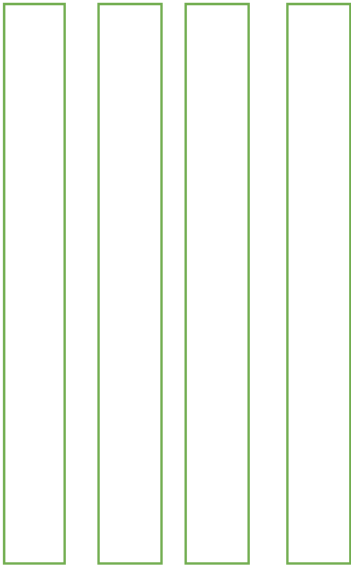
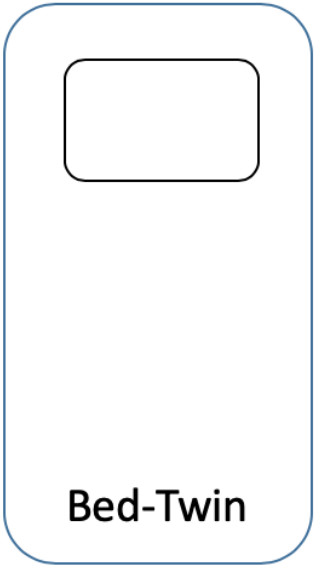
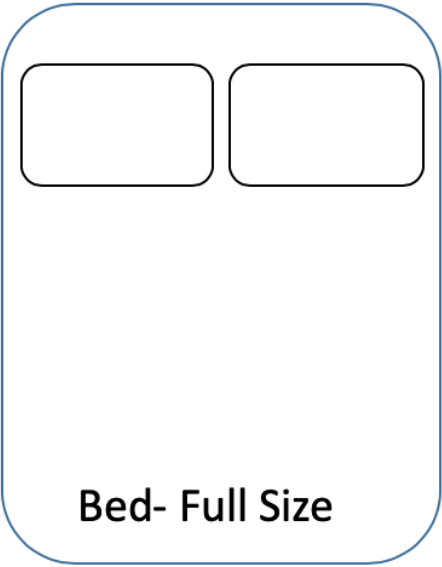
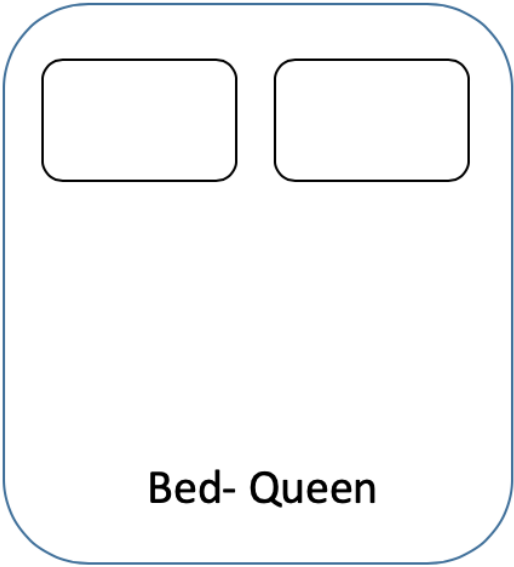

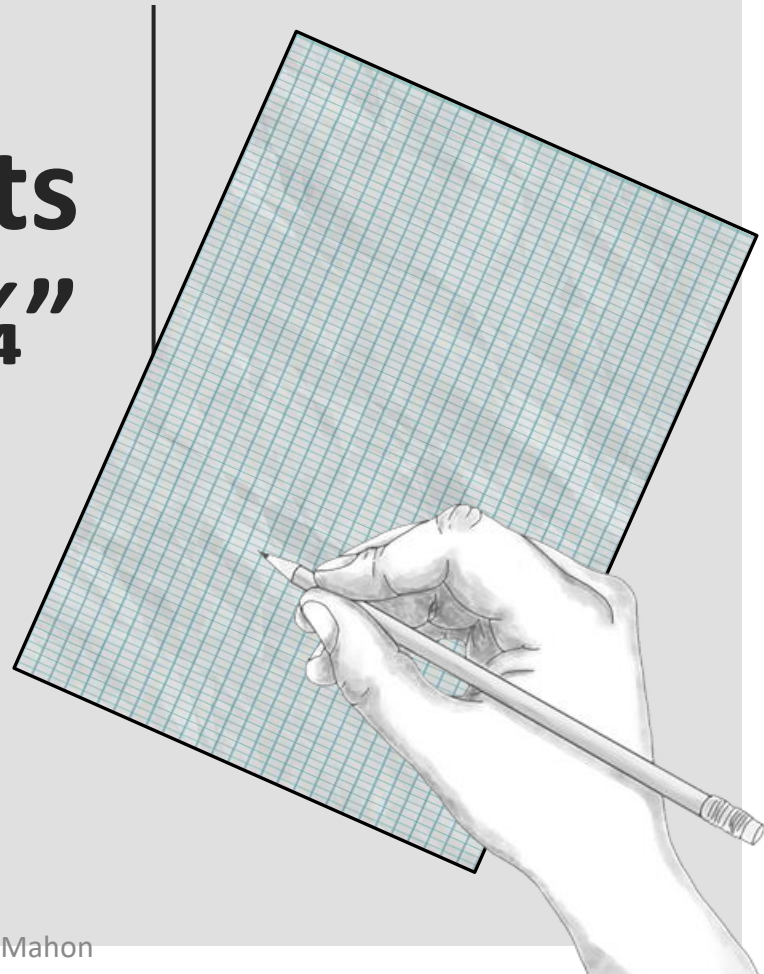
Doors and walls- wall too long? Cut it your measurement. Need a door- add how it opens with dotted lines



What else do you need in your tiny house? Use the shapes provided to create what you need. Make your own symbols as needed. Be creative!

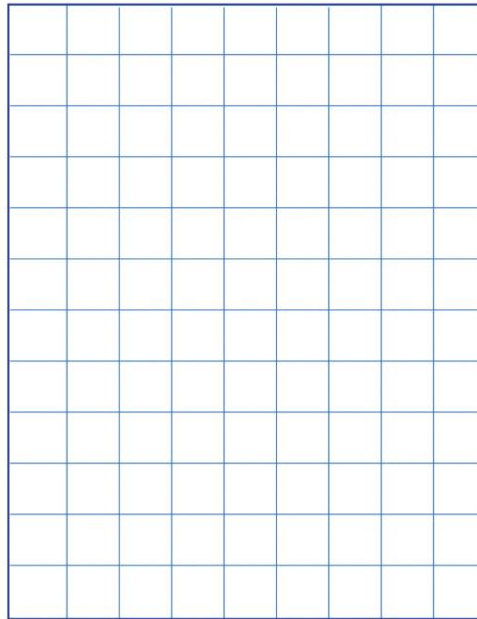

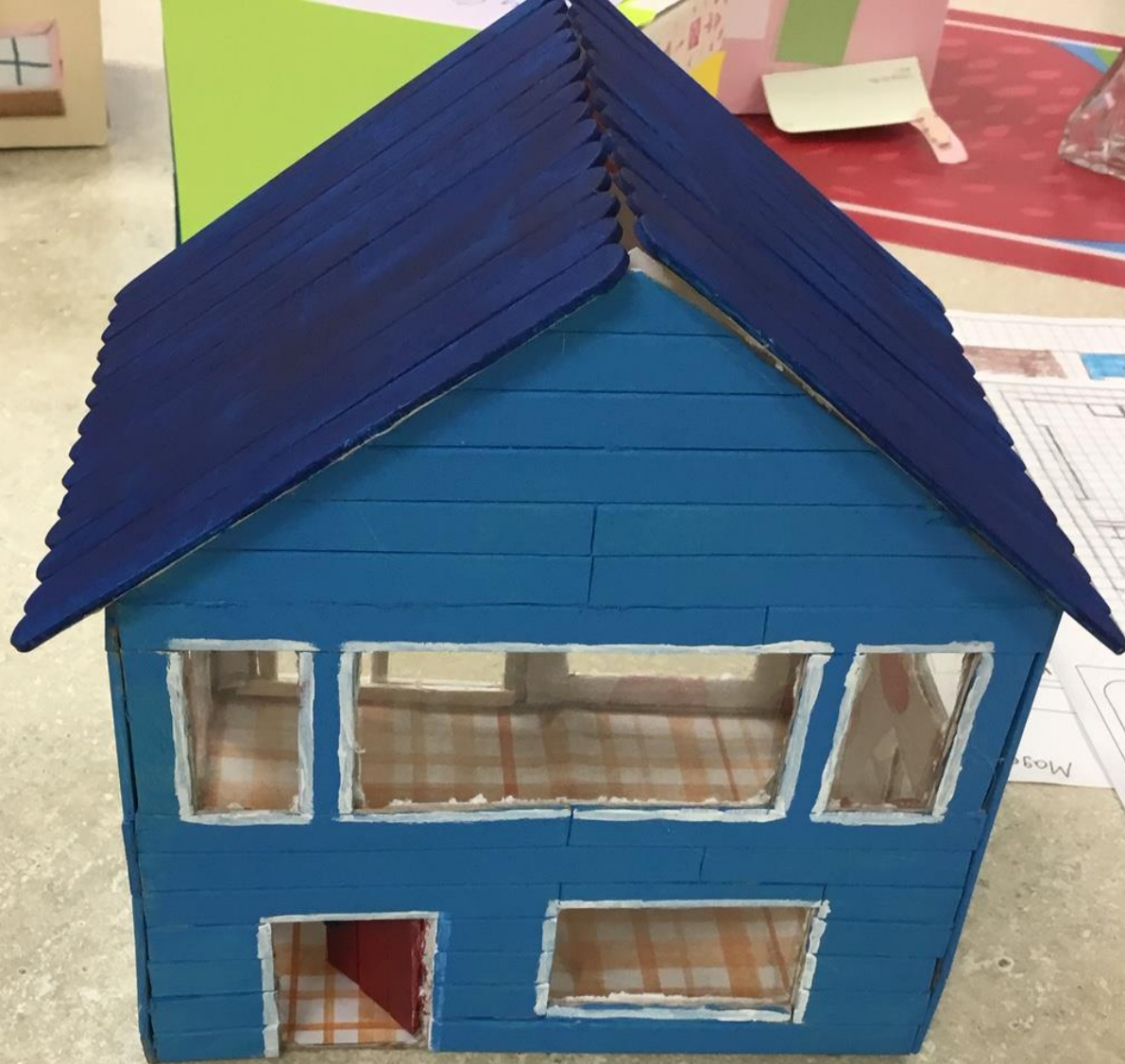
